As an experienced academic and President of the Moroccan Chapter of the Internet Society (ISOC Morocco), I have been deeply engaged in Internet governance across Africa for many years. My sustained commitment—both in higher education and in the broader Interne community—has provided me with strategic insight and a deep understanding of critical issues such as IP resource management, digital infrastructure development, and Internet sovereignty on the continent.

Through this candidacy, I seek to contribute meaningfully to AFRINIC's efforts to strengthen transparency, ensure institutional stability, and promote inclusive, community-based governance. I am particularly dedicated to advancing balanced regional representation, with a focus on North Africa, and to ensuring that African technical and institutional voices are fully heard and considered within AFRINIC's processes. I firmly believe that my expertise, experience, and collaborative vision position me to bring significant value to AFRINIC's Board as it continues to pursue its mission of fostering an open, secure, and accessible Internet for all Africans.



Professional Background

Professor Aziz Hilali is a respected academic and a long-standing contributor to international Internet governance. He holds a PhD in Computer Science and Applied Mathematics from the University of Joseph Fourier in Grenoble, France. Over a distinguished 41-year career, he served as Professor at the National Institute of Telecommunications Engineers in Morocco, holding numerous academic and administrative leadership roles. He also contributed internationally as an Associate Professor at ENSIMAG in Grenoble.

In 1994, he co-founded the Moroccan Internet Society (MISOC), which he currently chairs. Under his leadership, MISOC recognized as the Moroccan Chapter of the Internet Society, and an ICANN At-Large Structure, has promoted digital literacy, Internet adoption, and national and international cooperation on Internet issues.

At the international level, Prof. Hilali has demonstrated strong leadership in Internet governance. He is the current President of the Mediterranean Federation of Internet Associations (FMAI), based in Tunis, and served on the United Nations Multistakeholder Advisory Group (MAG) for the Internet Governance Forum (IGF) from 2009 to 2013. He also chaired the MAG of the North Africa IGF (NAIGF) for four years, working to enhance cooperation across the Maghreb and Sahel regions.

His active engagement with the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) includes representing Africa on the At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC). As Chair of AFRALO, he strengthened African perspectives in global Internet policy debates. His leadership extended to organizing major global events such as the ICANN meetings held in Marrakech in 2016 and 2019, underscoring his capacity to coordinate international, multistakeholder initiatives.

Prof. Hilali is deeply engaged in AFRINIC's ecosystem, where he has actively participated in policy discussions advocating for inclusive, transparent, and community-driven management of IP resources. His dedication to public service, combined with his extensive experience and pan-African network, positions him as an ideal candidate to serve on AFRINIC's Board. He brings with him a trusted reputation, deep technical and policy expertise, and a strategic vision to advance AFRINIC's mission, while representing the interests of North Africa and the broader African Internet community.

Professional Background

I am an entrepreneur and digital strategist with more than 25 years of experience in the ICT sector. My professional journey began in software development and IT architecture, then expanded into digital transformation, innovation consulting, and organizational leadership. I am the founder and CEO of RED INNOV, a technology ecosystem composed of three companies: RED TIC (specializing in IT recruitment and digital sourcing), RED 360 (digital marketing and communication), and RED DATA (focused on SDWAN, digital vaults, and business process automation). Together, these companies contribute to digital transformation for both public and private sectors in Morocco and beyond.

In 2022, I was elected President of APEBI (the Moroccan Federation of IT, Telecommunications, and Offshoring), where I have led structural reforms, enhanced financial stability, and initiated several national and international strategic partnerships. Under my leadership, APEBI co-constructed the "Digital Morocco 2030" strategy with the Ministry of Digital Transition and took a leading role in promoting Moroccan tech companies through international events such as GITEX Africa.



I am also the founding President of the African Federation for Digital Business (FADB), an organization that brings together private sector players from across Africa to strengthen cooperation, advocate for digital sovereignty, and accelerate the digital transition of African economies.
