The landscape & our future

- Servicing 3 billion people by 2050 in Africa region: exponential growth of networks ... and regulations ... even policies?
- IPv4 exhaustion: others coming to our region for v4 – deal with that with community (Gov and LEAs involvement?)
- Still difficult IPv6 take up: convince the decision makers along with the techies
- Sustainability of AFRINIC: operational performance, disaster recovery & business continuity, costing v6 ...

- Position AFRINIC as the 'backbone' of everything on IP in the region
- Strengthen foundation for growth from start up to SME and even big organisation (*team to pursue our main goal together and not work in silos...*)

TO DO List: Translate RER in AFRINIC

- Solid, stable and secure infrastructure with redundancy
- Strengthen the team (focus on AFRINIC's bright future, AFRINIC knowledge, member focus, culture, right processes (ISO certification helps), team work, on time delivery, etc.
- Review AFRINIC Strategic Plan with Board, Community and staff (last 2009-2011 contains good basis to build on)



TO DO List: Translate RER in AFRINIC

from operational performance to operational excellence

- Give AFRINIC more visibility – INRs are there to be used and by all
- Introduce new publications and websites geared to activities, members and community
- Work with Team on development projects (FIRE, trainings, distance learning...)

Communications & PR

- Communications – internal (AFRINIC the organisation) and external (work with MS and on members, on partners...)
- PR and marketing: “sell” AFRINIC through various strategies and platforms, branding, social media...
- Events and sponsorship – organising and managing AIS, AFRINIC meetings, trainings...
- Technical communications – communiqués, reports, annual report, handouts, factsheets



Communications & PR

- Main websites development and maintenance
- Material production & designs
- Develop existing partnerships with regional bodies
- Seek more partnerships and develop new relationships and agreements
- Develop new publications and websites

Communications & PR

- Visual rebranding – new logo, new colours, new website, new philosophy built on IPv6 and future of Internet
- Launch of Africa Internet Summit
- Fire Programme grantees (11) and first award winner (1 in 2012)



Engineering & IT

- **RPKI**: certification services to start soon.
- **DNSSEC**: Sign all our zones and also now providing the service to our members (Successful live key rollover last month).
- **DNS Anycast service** for our infrastructure and extended to ccTLDs: More than 12 ccTLDs using the service now (few still waiting for update at IANA level)
- **Routing Registry** - phase 1 of deployment completed. Objects can be created and updated
- **Extension of MYAFRINIC** to New Membership process.
- *Transitioning to an all Virtualized Infrastructure with a regional reorganisation of our services.*



IT & Engineering

- Take infrastructure virtual, redundant
- Work on an R&D department
- Operational examples:
 - HRMS: completed and handed to HR
 - Collaborative Tool / SSO / LDAP – Completed
 - IPv6 Training labs: JNB and CPT commissioned - Total of 3 labs available. 4th one programmed for end of July
 - Office physical security, access Control system is fully functional

On way to completion:

- New member registration portal
- Deployment of new datacentre in Cape Town
- Virtualization of Mauritius datacentre
- Email infrastructure / Mailing infrastructure

IT & Engineering

- eVoting platform: Based on new bylaw, few changes were applied to our election platform.
 - No more than 5 proxies could be given to one single person
 - Only Firefox browser currently supported for the renegotiation of BPKI certificate: Migration to a newer version of EJBCA to support more browsers- test in progress
 - A new organization category, Registered Member, was added to MyAFRINIC as required by the bylaw.

MS: Registration Services

- Cumulative Resources Issued
 - IPv4

72 IPv4 prefixes were allocated (amount to 570,368 / 32s) and 39 IPv4 prefixes (amount to 35,072 /32s) were assigned to our members as at 31 May 2013.
 - IPv6

18 IPv6 allocations (/32 prefixes) and 10 IPv6 assignments (8 /48 , /42 and /46) prefixes were issued as at 31 May 2013.
 - 67ASNs were issued as at 31 May 2013.

MS: Trend in improvements

- Stalled tickets: identified, evaluated reasons and put remediation action in place in Q1
 - new members not being savvy in IP planning
 - Team trained internally to recognise problem and do more handholding
 - WHOIS database clean up
- Performing under the standard set by management
 - TTR for new IP resource: 15 working days
 - TTR for additional IP resource: 7 working days

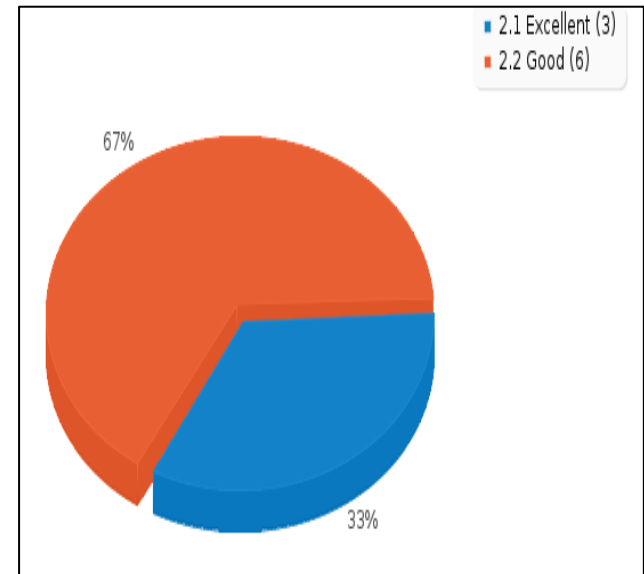
- Intuitive new member portal
